## God in America

God in America, is a presentation of AMERICAN EXPERIENCE and FRONTLINE, and explores the historical role of religion in the public life of the United States. The six-hour series interweaves documentary footage, historical dramatization, and interviews with religious historians. God in America examines the potent and complex interaction between religion and democracy, the origins of the American concept of religious liberty, and the controversial evolution of that ideal in the nation's courts and political arena. The series considers the role religious ideas and institutions have played in social reform movements from abolition to civil rights, examining the impact of religious faith on conflicts from the American Revolution to the Cold War, and how guarantees of religious freedom created a competitive American religious marketplace. It also explores the intersection of political struggle and spiritual experience in the lives of key American historical figures including Franciscan Friars and the Pueblo leader Po'pay, Puritan leader John Winthrop and dissident Anne Hutchinson, Catholic Bishop John Hughes, abolitionist Frederick Douglass, Presidents Thomas Jefferson and Abraham Lincoln, reform Rabbi Isaac Meyer Wise, Scopes trial combatants William Jennings Bryan and Clarence Darrow, evangelist Billy Graham, civil rights leader Martin Luther King, Jr., and the Moral Majority's Jerry Falwell. "The American story cannot be fully understood without understanding the country's religious history," says series executive producer Michael Sullivan. "By examining that history, God in America will offer viewers a fresh, revealing, and challenging portrait of the country."

## Electronic Offerings possible in the Future?

As part of making the church greener and updating the financial system, the use of Electronic Fund Transfers (EFT) is being investigated. The company (Vanco) that I'm currently looking into is endorsed by the United Methodist General Council on Finance and Administration (GCFA). A link to the secure Vanco website would be available right from our own church website.

The advantages of EFT through Vanco are:

1. You can choose the exact date that you would like to have the money transferred out of your account.
2. You can choose whether to have the offering recur on a schedule of your choice or choose to set up each individual offering as you wish.
3. The church would save money by not having to purchase Offering Envelopes for those individuals that choose to use EFT.
4. Each account is password protected and individuals can view personal giving history at any time,
5. Vanco allows the website to be set up for offerings to be made to the Current Expense Account as well as offerings to the Designated Funds approved during a recent Church Conference.

I would like to find out how much interest there is within the congregation in being able to use EFT. I still need to investigate the cost to the church and when this service could be launched.

The coalition is looking for volunteers for four committees. Typically each committee meets once a month for 1-2 hours with a few extra hours during each month for any assignments.

The four committees and their responsibilities are:

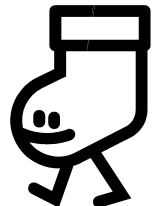
1. **Steering Committee:** Works directly with Flower City Habitat for Humanity to determine schedules as well as overseeing the other three committees.

4. **Volunteer Committee:** Organizes the scheduling of volunteers who will build the house once construction has started.

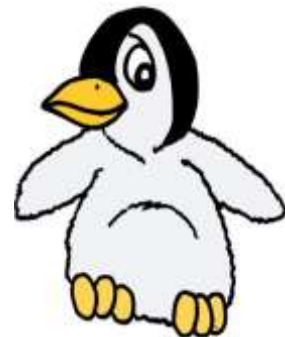

## Puzzle BROOCH

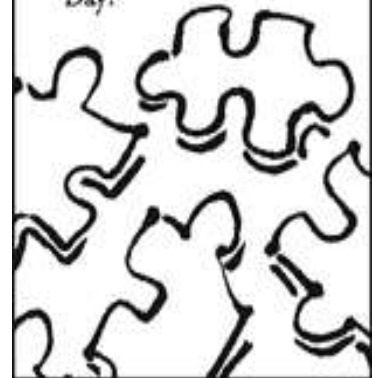
Make this keepsake to let your mom, grandma or aunt know that you wouldn't be complete without her!

### What you need:

- Several old puzzle pieces
- Acrylic paints
- Paintbrush
- Craft glue
- Sequins or small buttons
- Metal jewelry safety pin (flat on the bottom)

### What you do:

1. Paint the puzzle pieces and let them dry.
2. Come up with a design; for example, place two pieces on the bottom and one on top.
3. Glue the pieces in place so they form one brooch. Decorate by gluing on sequins or buttons.
4. When the brooch is completely dry, glue a jewelry safety pin on the bottom.
5. Give the gift on Mother's Day!
