PENTECOST

Nineteenth-century evangelist Dwight L. Moody was walking down a New York City street, thinking about a sentence he'd heard: "The world has yet to see what God can do with a man who is wholly yielded to him."

Suddenly Moody felt a great yearning and cried out, "O God, make me that man!" He was so overwhelmed with God's love and with heartfelt passion to reach lost people that he had to stop at a friend's house to rest.

In Birth of the Body, Ray Stedman says this is what Luke is talking about when he describes the events of Pentecost. "When John the Baptist predicted that Jesus would come and baptize with the Holy Spirit and with fire, he meant that there would be an unexplainable passion about the church."

As we feel the Pentecost passion, let's yield ourselves wholly to God and see what he does with us!



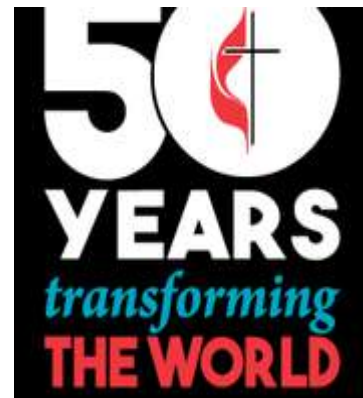
In a Dallas auditorium on April 23, 1968, more than 10,000 people joined hands and repeated in unison:

“Lord of the church, we are united in thee, in thy church, and now in The United Methodist Church. Amen.”

With those words, the 750,000-member Evangelical United Brethren Church and the 10.3 million-member Methodist Church became one. Additionally, the Central Jurisdiction – an instrument of segregation in the Methodist Church – was eliminated.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR GIVING

Many times, members of our congregation have asked the Church Memorial Committee "what are some of the Church needs or wants that might be opportunities for a donation which are not planned in our annual operating budget?" Usually this question happens when a member of our congregation passes away. Their friends and family donate money to a memorial fund established to honor the deceased person. The Church Memorial Committee then tries to identify a significant item of value or ministry for the donation with the assistance of the deceased nearest relative.

Another type of request happens when a Church member would like to donate funds to the Church, but has no idea what the Church needs. This situation occurs often. For many years the UMC of North Chili has not had a published list of needs-like a "Wish List" or "Want List".

So, in order to remedy the absence of such a list, the Trustees with Church Council approval have prepared a list of current Church needs or wants. Since this is the first published list, most of the items selected reflect the current modernization program of the Church meeting room and relocation of the historical files. The following items with cost estimates are presented for your thoughtful consideration as opportunities for giving:

1. MEETING ROOM CONFERENCE TABLE- \$500 to \$700 ESTIMATE
2. 8 TO 10 MEETING ROOM CONFERENCE CHAIRS -\$120 to \$150 EACH
3. WINDOW TREATMENT-BLINDS, CURTAINS, ETC-\$200 to \$400 ESTIMATE
4. MEETING ROOM COMMERCIAL CARPETING-\$1,700 QUOTE
5. MEETING ROOM LED LIGHTING UPGRADE-\$400 ESTIMATE

AND

6. A DONATION OF ANY DOLLAR AMOUNT WOULD BE APPRECIATED TO PROVIDE GENERAL SUPPORT FOR UPGRADING THE CHURCH MEETING ROOM
