Communion Sunday

What is World Communion Sunday?

World Communion Sunday is one of six churchwide Special Sundays with offerings of The United Methodist Church. World Communion Sunday calls the church to reach out to all people and model diversity among God's children. The special offering provides World Communion Scholarships, the Ethnic Scholarship Program and the Ethnic In-Service Training Program.

When do we celebrate World Communion Sunday?

United Methodists celebrate it on the first Sunday in October. **October 7, 2018**

How does The United Methodist Church distribute the offerings received?

The treasurer of the General Council on Finance and Administration distributes net receipts, after payment of promotional expenses, to the administering agencies:

World Communion Scholarships: 50% (General Board of Global Ministries), with at least one-half of the annual amount designated for ministries beyond the United States; Supports graduate national & international UM students related to Global Ministries' mission partners.

Ethnic Scholarship Program: 35% (General Board of Higher Education and Ministry) Assists undergrads studying in the US pursuing a call to ministry.

Ethnic In-Service Training Program: 15% (General Board of Higher Education and Ministry) Recruit, train and retain ethnic United Methodist women and men in leadership positions in every level of the church and its ministry. Encourage and provide grants for partnerships and collaborative efforts between and with campus ministry, chaplaincy and institutions of higher education and general agencies.

Why Be A Lay Servant?

We would love to have you join us as a Lay Servant in service to Christ. Following Christ is a journey, not a destination. We all fall short of his example and commands on a daily basis. All he asks is that we put our faith and trust in him and accept him as our one and only Savior.

So, why be a Lay Servant? The Lay Servant Committee offers a wide variety of training twice a year. Courses in the Spring are generally held at local churches over a 2 to 4-week period. The Fall training is a retreat held at Camp Asbury, starting Friday evening and ending after a Sunday morning service. These courses range from helping us identify our gifts to learning how to deliver a Sermon. There are also courses to strengthen leadership, learn to develop a better prayer life, and so on. For many, the Fall retreat is an opportunity to renew old friendships, find quiet time to meditate with nature, and recharge our spiritual batteries for the year ahead.

This Ministry was changed from "Lay Speaker" to "Lay Servant" because our focus IS NOT on the pulpit. Yes, there are several who help with Pulpit Supply. However, the vast majority take the skills identified and strengthened through Lay Servant training to lead Prayer groups, start a Media Ministry, provide leadership to Youth group, and so on. The opportunities are endless.

Becoming a Lay Servant demonstrates a commitment to continuous improvement and opens opportunities for growth to help solidify the ministry of all involved. We would love to have you join us on this path in the local church and beyond.
